

Preaching Through The Christian Year: Year A: A Comprehensive Commentary On The Lectionary



Synopsis

Because the Bible is an ancient book, it invites the preacher back into its world in order to understand; because the Bible is the church's Scripture, it moves forward into our world and addresses us here and now. This is the first volume of a comprehensive three-volume set of commentaries of all of the lectionary texts for Sunday reading (including the Psalms) and for special days in all communions, treating the readings for each year in a single volume. Year B will follow in September 1993; Year C in September 1994. The volumes are based on the newly revised The Common Lectionary: The Lectionary Proposed by the Consultation on Texts (1992) together with other readings kept in the Episcopal, Lutheran, and Roman Catholic churches. The entire set will prove useful also for those who do not follow the lectionary, since each volume provides commentaries on a vast number of texts and includes a complete index of those texts. Preaching Through the Christian Year is an extensive revision and expansion of the author's earlier work (Preaching the New Common Lectionary), taking into account changes in appointed texts, revised translations of the Bible, additions to the liturgical calendar, and the like. The result is a new, larger, and improved commentary to aid those who preach and teach. The authors of this important series teach at Candler School of Theology at Emory University, Atlanta, and are renowned scholars in their particular disciplines—preaching and Old and New Testament studies.

As a seminary professor of New Testament, I know I'm supposed to eschew any "lectionary helps" because they are so often a shortcut to students' or pastors' own reading of the text they are going to preach. More often I eschew lectionary helps because they are dull, irrelevant to the preaching task, or moralistic in their appropriation of scripture. Preaching through the Christian Year is a wonderful exception to the rule. It's a three-volume collection (each sold separately). The authors almost always offer excellent pump-priming material for my own preaching. The exegesis is sound yet not so technical that you're sorry you asked in the first place. And the sermon ideas are thought-provoking if not always the direction I head. Worth the money!

I found the subject matter clearly understandable but most important for me, it aids in making sermon preparation. An ordained Priest showed a Deacon Formation class this book, several members of the class ordered the book. The minister that brought the book, uses it regularly. It is an excellent resource: I'm using it for my preparation of my sermon this Sunday.

It covers a wide range of ideas and exegesis covering each scripture from the years lectionary, providing endless support for sermons. I have years A and B as well and they are a valuable part of my library.

Good, concise commentary - emphasizing scriptural links rather than interpretive opinion - all within the context of the lectionary season and Sunday's readings.
