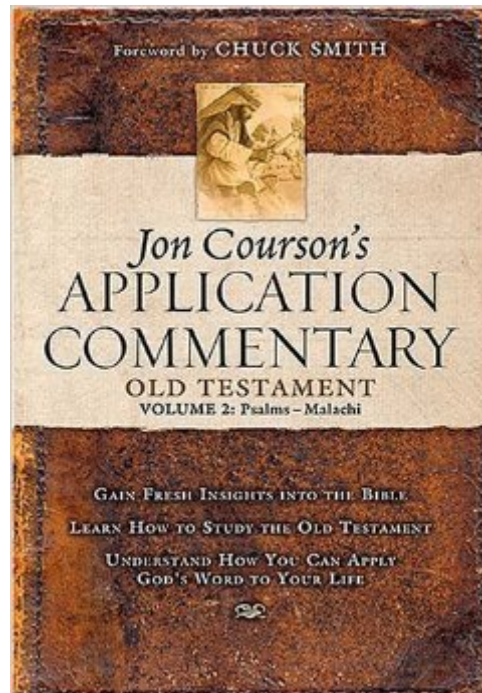

I love it. He has great insight into the Scriptures. My only comment is that the text is in King James Version which is sometimes difficult to understand a particular passage. I usually have my other Bible handy if I don't understand the verse. I would highly recommend this commentary.

I have all 3 of Jon Courson's Application Commentary books and they are all wonderful! He takes the entire Bible, just a verse or 2 at a time and gives insight in to what it says. This has been a great help for me to really dig deep into the Bible. I used this series to help me prepare for a young adult Bible study I led and it was incredibly helpful. Read the sample text and you'll see how good this commentary is - I strongly recommend it!

His commentaries bring the bible to life along with inserting helpful hebrew and greek.

I have all 3 of these commentaries in my Kindle Ap. I use it every day. Jon Courson's commentary is excellent. He goes into the Greek and often explains why certain verses that seem strange have different meanings in the original Scripture Version. In Psalms, as an example, he sets up each Psalm so that we know where David was in his life when he wrote them. He often offers other verses that tie the scripture you are studying to each other. Just excellent. Highly recommend.
