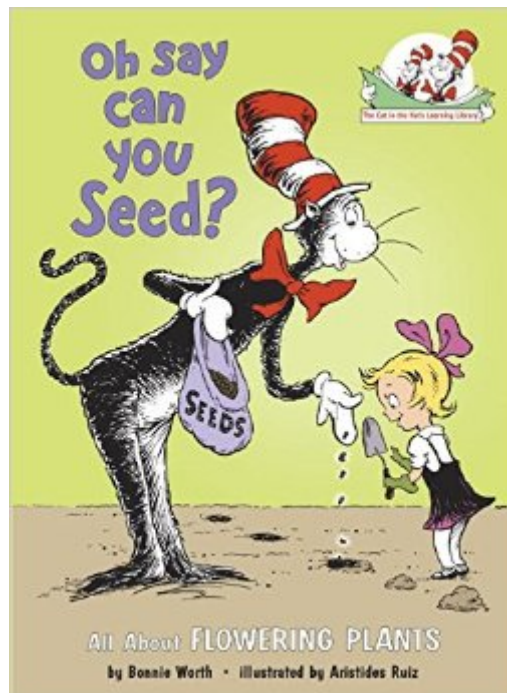

Joining the ranks of characters who live on long after their creators has passed away, it's The Cat in the Hat! Here, you get to see the cat, Thing 1 and Thing 2, and the two kids as they explore the basics of flowering plants. The prose is at an appropriate level for kids who like the longer Dr. Seuss books. The illustrations (by Aristides Ruiz) are so close to the original that I couldn't tell the difference. The only minor quibble is that the words don't flow QUITE as well as Theodore Geisel's words. Then again, few writer's words do. Also, Ms. Worth is faced with trying to teach a subject and entertain at the same time. At that task, she succeeds admirably. Highly recommended.

Full of information about the growth, parts and functions of plants. It's great for preschoolers who already read well on their own or who are often read to, because it is truly a head start on the tools

they will be given to learn with in school (textbooks). I think this book is great for older children and adults who love Seuss as well. We love this book in my house and this was the second time buying it (the first one had an unfortunate accident) and as well we have purchased other Cat in the Hat Learning Library books as a result of our enjoyment with this one and are not disappointed with any of them.

This book was a great way to teach my students about plant life cycles. I teach 5th grade and this book was perfect for them to understand. Even 5th grade students are still fascinated with how Dr Seuss books keep the rhyme up so well throughout. It actually covers the topic in a scientific and entertaining way.

Very good book to teach children about seeds and how they grow or travel. It is age appropriate for elementary students and the children are interested on it because they love Dr, Seuss characters and the colors in the pictures of this book. As a teacher, I will use this book again in my lesson plans.

Cat in the hat learning library books are quickly becoming my 3 year olds favorite. All of these books are great for a child who is curios and wants to learn about these. This was especially great after we planted our garden by seed, she was very interested in the book because she could relate. Not a bad read and a tad less hard to understand than some others we have read. Great info on the parts of the seeds and how they germinate etc. Would be great in a classroom.

A little too in depth for my little ones. I was expecting just a cute little rhyme about seeds growing into plants with sun and water. This book goes into the parts of a plant and other factoids. Great for kids a little older- 6-7 yrs old (My girls are all under 5).

This is a fun book to help kids learn all about seeds! It also includes additional information in the back to further teach your children. My son is only 1, so he doesn't sit long for story time, but its still fun to read it to him!

Well, I checked this out from the library for my almost-2 year old who enjoys books on the 3-5 age level and loves The Cat in the Hat.. This book was too advanced for her. I think the minimum age would be five, but frankly even a middle-schooler might find it useful if taking biology as an easy and

fun way to explain the plant. Maybe a 4 year old with a love of plants and biology might get it, but otherwise wait till 5. It just has too much information and too many technical terms for a younger child. I thought the book was cleverly written with great Dr.-Seuss style. My LO immediately recognized the cat in the hat and actually asked me to read the book a second time. there are boxes with additional information for older readers which expands the age range. I enjoyed the book immensely. I will check it out again (or buy it) when LO is about 5. I was trying to get several books on the concept of seeds/plants/trees for LO, as I think when she hears/sees the same topic in different ways she tends to understand it better and learn the vocabulary quicker. (this of course to be read alongside with planting our garden in a couple of weeks!) This particular book will have to wait until she is older. in the mean time, "Up Down and Around" is perfect for her age group. She loves it.
