

My son is six and is a huge baseball fan. For now, I read these books to him, but he is starting to be able to read some of the chapters on his own. He really loves that the characters carry through each book and I love that he is learning a little bit about new cities as we read each one. I'm so happy to have found this series for him!

Cousins, Kate and Mike, are baseball fanatics. Lucky for them, Kate's mom happens to be a sports reporter, so they get to tag along on plenty of trips to the ballpark. Each game offers up a new mystery, and Kate and Mike put their heads together to solve the puzzle. Like when Kate's mom took them to see the Phillie's play. Hot dogs zoomed through the air as the game geared up. The Phillie Phanatic rode out on his ATV, drawing attention from the crowd. Everyone was exited, watching the game, when suddenly, during a crucial play, the bat shattered into pieces. Disappointment echoed through the crowd.
