Strange that it seems to work but the main focus is on the collection of varied people who make up the one family: various ages - intergenerational, people of color, etc. Children reading this book will count the items in the pictures which mostly adhere to the number being discussed, but sometimes not. Altogether an interesting book for reasons that have nothing to do with counting.
