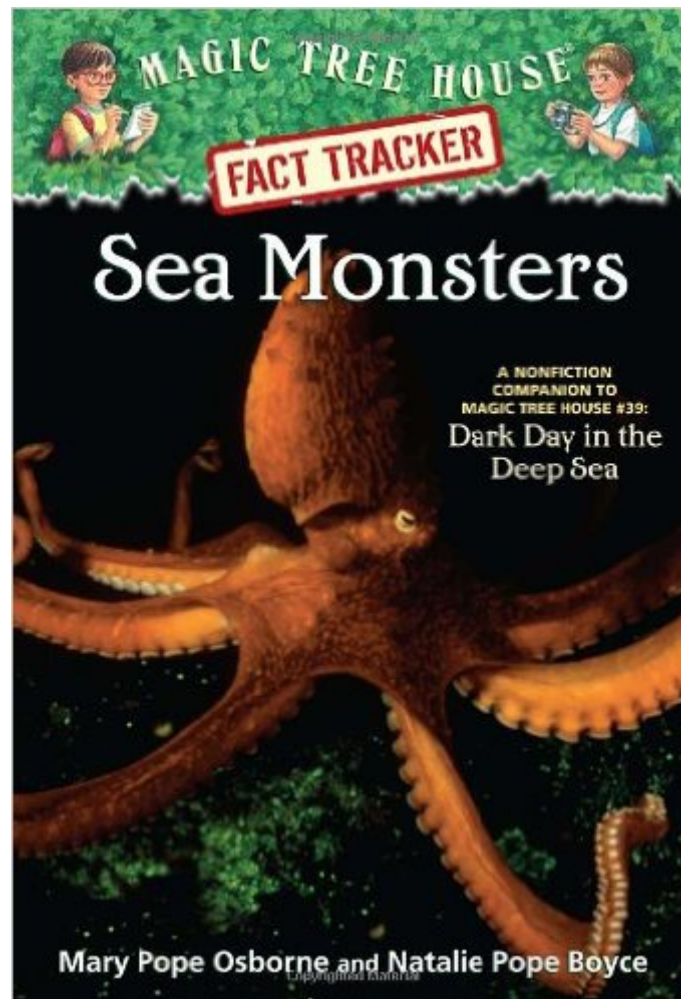

We give Sea Monsters by Mary Pope Osborne and Natalie Pope Boyce five out of five stars! It is a Magic Tree House research guide. We liked it because it gives readers information about new and prehistoric sea creatures, and sea life and their adaptations. For example, the Viperfish has 350 lights inside its mouth. Also, Colossal Squids do not give up easily when Sperm Whales attack them and try to eat them. Octopuses have sticky pads in there arms called suckers. We would highly recommend this book to grades 4 and up.

This book is by no means an encyclopedia, but has enough photos and variety (discussions of prehistoric and mythical sea creatures, in addition to contemporary sea creatures and explorers/scientists) to hold an eight-year old boy's attention.

I can't tell you how many of these books my son has read but it's a lot! He loves that the give real facts and a story. He has read this one a couple of times:)
