

The chapters on relationships and resistance are gold for anyone trying to lead change but feel stuck. I'm a better pastor for reading this book and feel like I am seeing more clearly the challenges facing me and the church... and I'm excited for what's ahead!

Tod Bolsinger masterfully uses the Lewis and Clark expedition to illustrate the need to adapt and move forward in the world around us.
